Dr. Isao Fujimoto was a faculty member of the Asian American Studies department at University of California, Davis and founder of the Community Development program. Fujimoto was involved with community based organizations which helped rural, minority communities throughout the country. Prior to joining the faculty at UCD, he was a United States Army

correspondent in Korea and taught chemistry and English at San Jose High School in San Jose, California.

Fujimoto was born in 1933 and grew up on the Yakima Indian reservation in Wapato, Washington. During World War II, he and his family were inmates of the Heart Mountain, Wyoming and Tule Lake, California concentration camps. Fujimoto was the eldest of 13 siblings in a family that formerly farmed strawberries in the Santa Clara county communities of Madrone, Coyote and Morgan Hill. After the war, Fujimoto would pursue higher learning and went on to graduate from the University of California Berkeley, Stanford and eventually earned his PhD in Development Sociology in 2010 at Cornell. At the age of 89, Dr. Isao Fujimoto passed away on February 25th, 2022. His contributions to the field of Asian American Studies as a scholar activist have helped center the field as a community learning platform and discourse.

This collection contains paraphernalia, lecture materials, research items, and personal photographs collected and created by Isao Fujimoto that reflect his student focused and community outreach commitments to Asian American Studies and his broader life's work.
