Her research interests include the Manang and Manong Generation, Critical Filipinx Studies, history, radical Asian American feminisms, and Asian American Studies.

The collection includes community donations and paraphernalia that Salinas collected during her time at Cal Poly SLO in the history MA program and during their research trips along the greater Central Coast (2014-2022).
